

Watering Days Remain the Same

Many areas of central and north Florida are required to water only one day per week in winter months. However Toho's current watering days remain the same.

Even with current restrictions your lawn and landscape do not necessarily need water that often...

In fall and winter, days are shorter and cooler making lawns grow slowly or not at all. The water needs of plants are greatly reduced.

In fact, according to University of Florida research, that may be too much at this time of year. Less frequent, but thorough irrigations will help establish a healthier lawn with a deeper, more viable root system.

Don't make the mistake of watering every allowed day; let your lawn tell you when it needs water. You'll see spots in the lawn that turn bluish-grey, footprints remain in the grass long after being made, and many leaf blades folded in half lengthwise.
