

Toho Water Toho Reservoir & WTP Expansion



What This Project Brings to Our Community

The Toho Reservoir and Water Treatment Plant is a major collaborative effort between Toho and Osceola County designed to tackle three challenges at once: capturing stormwater to boost our irrigation supply, improving local water quality, and reducing the risk of flooding in the Judge Farms area.

Scheduled for completion in 2028, this state-of-the-art facility will be capable of pumping up to **16 million gallons of water per day** to our community (this is the equivalent amount of water needed to fill 3.2 million five-gallon buckets stacked end-to-end and stretched nearly 5,000 miles).

How It Works

- **Dedicated Treatment:** The new facility is built exclusively to treat water captured directly from the reservoir.
- **Smart Water Reuse:** Initially, this treated water will safely supply local irrigation needs.
- **Future-Ready Design:** We have built this facility with the future in mind, leaving room to expand its capabilities to supply clean drinking water down the road.
